Infection Control - New measures from June'22

In early June'22, NHS England reframed the guidance to practices about issues especially the wearing of masks to start to transition to a pre-pandemic state. Patients are not required to wear a mask or face covering when attending the Practice <u>unless</u> they have respiratory symptoms however, we have encouraged all patients to continue to do so.

We are also still seeing patients with respiratory symptoms or fever in the hot zone in the cabin. The surge in cases which has followed the Jubilee Weekend and an increase in mixing has vindicated this choice as numbers rise.

Our staff continue to take extra control measures on handwashing and cleaning, to wear masks in communal areas and when seeing patients (although this is deemed discretionary) and we are still testing twice weekly. The policy is under constant review according to local levels as well as staffing pressures and risks

Face-to-Face Consultations

The numbers of patients being seen face to face is steadily rising however many are still very comfortably managed by telephone, text, video or e-consult. The receptionists can book in person appointments for certain conditions, if availability allows however we still frequently offer a triage call from a GP or paramedic to decide when and how patient's needs are to be met - as overall demand for appointments is rising some prioritisation is essential.

Other News:

'Sick or Fit for Work Notes'

Effective 1st July '22 - Pharmacists and some other healthcare professionals, other than just GPs, will be able to sign people off-sick from work, under new rules. The law change will take effect in July and apply across England, Wales and Scotland. The aim is to free up GPs time.

People off work for more than seven consecutive days because of illness may need to show a note from a healthcare professional to their employer. These "fit notes" say if they are:

- "unfit for work"
- "may be fit for work" subject to some adaptations in the workplace or role

Nurses, occupational therapists, pharmacists (working in hospitals and GP practices) and physiotherapists will be able to provide the notes, **in addition to GPs.**
